


Advonet is working with Touchstone, Age UK Leeds and SignHealth to make advocacy better in Leeds.

### Leeds Autism AIM gets Big Lottery funding!

Leeds Autism AIM has been got three years' funding from the Big Lottery Fund.



The new funds will help them to run their services. They include the Lovell Autism Hub.

It will be added to funding from the Leeds NHS Clinical Commissioning Group - CCG.

AIM supported over 400 people over the last year. Thank you to the Big Lottery and CCG funders for their support.









### **Changes at Advonet**

We won a contract to give advocacy support in Leeds for the next 5 years, until 2023.

We will do more around involving people who get advocacy support.

We will work with Touchstone,
SignHealth and Age UK Leeds. This
will mean supporting black and minority
ethnic (BME) and older people more
often.

Advonet will also promote selfadvocacy. We will help more people to speak for themselves.

Advonet will be doing pop-up advocacy support. There will be sessions at community hubs in autumn 2018.

We are excited about our plans for the next 5 years.

**Bushra Javed** is our new Peer and Volunteer Advocacy Manager. She will manage all the volunteer advocates.






Rosie Whitmore, Paul Holland, Kevin Speakman and Irene Crawshaw are all Advocacy Managers. They will manage the different teams of advocates.

## Volunteer Citizen Advocates needed

Advonet are looking for volunteers to support adults with learning disabilities in Leeds as Citizen Advocates.

Citizen advocates are volunteers who help with things like:

- Visiting and finding out what they want
- Being independent. Some people only have paid support in their lives
- Building a relationship and advocating when needed
- Identifying choices and decisions, but not making or guiding them

Full training over four days is provided. It includes learning disabilities awareness, safeguarding and advocacy training.




#### **Contact Advonet**
