This includes supporting the Meeting of Minds network in Kirklees, and the co-design of new national а Coproduction Kitemark, which we hope this service will achieve in its

first year of operation.

Age UK Leeds has a long history of providing advocacy to older people. SignHealth provides IMHA nationally a Leeds-based deaf and has advocate.

We will be weaving all these elements together into one seamless service, with seconded staff from the partners forming part of a single multi-skilled advocacy team, able to respond flexibly to diverse needs of clients.
