What is Care Act Advocacy?

What Care Act advocates do:

- Support and represent a person and facilitate their involvement in key processes
- Help a person consider and communicate what is important for their own wellbeing
- Agree with the person the best way of supporting and representing them

What Care Act Advocates don't do:

- Befriending
- Counselling
- Provide an advice service
- Provide social support
- Decide what is in a person's best interest

Am I entitled to a Care Act Advocate?

To make a referral for an independent Care Act Advocate, the person being supported must:

- Be going through one of the processes listed in the Care Act (including the examples on the opposite page)
- Have substantial difficulty engaging in the process
- Have no-one else to support them through this process

The Care Act and your rights



The care and support process

From April 1st 2015, the Care Act extends the right for eligible people to have independent advocacy to help them be actively involved in their care and support process. Here is a list of things that the care and support process includes:

- Care assessments
- Care and support planning
- Care and support reviews
- Safeguarding enquiries
- Safeguarding adult reviews (previously known as serious case reviews)

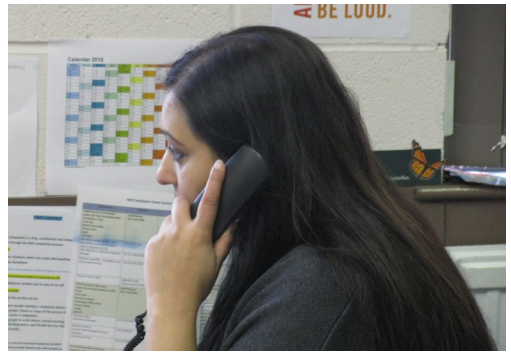
Making an advocacy referral

Referrals for an advocate under the Care Act can only be made by a Social Worker.
